Friday July 21st,

7:30 PM

Josh R. started the meeting with moment of silence followed by the serenity prayer... introducing our new **South Regional Trustee, Teresa J.** [panel 68 delegate] from Albuquerque New Mexico who will be with us this weekend helping facilitate our voting assembly on Sunday.

She told her story, having been from Kansas originally, also her experience with service in AA. Excited to be of service as our Regional Trustee, hopes that we feel comfortable and free to contact her for anything either thru our delegate Darin, or this weekend.

Q & A:

Asked about the process of the big book, 5th edition is reading new stories, last time done was 20 years ago. 2500 stories submitted. She is on that committee. Fun to read the stories. Hope to get to 100 by the Spring, followed by finalists.

Spanish book is coming along. The 5th Spanish edition, last she heard they were updating the translation of chapter 5.

Plain language translation is complete, working on the editing. The writing is complete. Will be ready to submit to conference in April where the conference will either approve or disapprove.

What is a plain language big book? Shorthand for plain and simple language, a translation of our english bb that says the same thing but in simpler words. So it is more accessible to a greater readership. Currently targeted at a 4th grade level.

Trustees literature committee's job is to take what the conference has decided to do, and try to make the work happen, move forward. They don't make decisions on their own.

GSR & DCM Sharing:

Bridget B. started the GSR sharing, encouraging GSRs to come up, ask questions, share issues in groups.

--

First share: smaller groups from small towns are struggling, hoping that other group members will support their group.

Others got up with the experience, some ppl after covid, had some hybrid meetings, then started hosting events to draw members, started an annual run/walk at the lake, try to have an event at least once a month, they also have ventured out to other groups asking for support, also invite speakers who usually bring ppl with them, hoping that will have them attend more on a regular basis.

--

First Assembly GSR, asking about what is going on, no idea.

Bridget B. had those new raise their hands, recommended ppl bring snacks during the voting assembly tomorrow. Encouraged to ask anyone anything so we can learn from each others experiences. Went over the agenda with the Discussion group explaining each element, the committee meetings, and picking one you might want to attend that interests you, or for info you want to bring back to the groups.

After lunch, past delegates will walk us thru a concept workshop over that.

Went thru the entire agenda, explaining each part and what we will be doing.

--

Have a difficult member that wants to change things in the group but not wanting to attend bus meetings, saying that ppl don't have to work steps etc. and the person is disruptive and believe is bad for newcomers.

Bridget B. call together 'senior members' after the meeting grab the newcomer, and say something like, 'we hear a lot in meetings, and that your experience is to focus on the solutions.'

GSR experience: addressing disruptive person: what they discovered, try to maintain the magic at their meetings. Tries not to vary from the path, need to remember recovery isn't how others are acting, but ours and our examples. Solutions are attractive, group was consistent and then the spirituality seeped in and changed the dynamic in the group. Attraction not promotion. Try to get the magic going.

GSR experience: Things tend to work themselves out in AA, focus on the solutions, attendance takes awhile, especially after covid, it takes time.

Question: can you go over Robert's Rules of order?

Bridget B. if you are a voting member you can go ask questions at the mike, we have motions and seconds, and discuss as long as need be, somebody may call the question, which is to bring the vote, sometimes the voting is simple majority or another majority such as 2/3'ds after that the minority opinion is called so anyone who was in the group that didn't get the most votes can stand up and voice their opinion, it is important to hear, and then the conference is asked if they want to change their vote, there have been many votes that after hearing the minority opinion, has altered the vote, it's a spiritual aspect of our process to be informed and hear all view points.

GSR Q: we have anonymity problems, some member was in the paper telling whole story and everything about the group even down to how much they pay in rent. Went out and did it on his own. Actually grew the group after that. :) The church wasn't upset, how to keep group not hostile towards him, wanted to keep his chip hostage, lighting torches...

Bridget B.: we are not the AA police, we need to just be good examples, and teach ppl bout the traditions, okay to talk to media, but cannot say name, or AA, just in recovery, no pictures. Suggest having a workshop on the traditions, etc. or have one tradition each month. Love ppl well.

GSR experience: work together the traditions and steps, different kinds of AA. Slowly learn.

GSR experience on anonymity and press, recommend doing the PI service work of going to the newspaper to let them know what AA allows. PI info for anonymity.

Bridget B. Anyone having trouble with biz meetings?

GSR experience: ppl don't want to attend. Need to do what you can to get the group conscience.

Bridget B. if changes are made in the groups, sometimes ppl don't like and you can say that if you go to business meetings, that's where we vote on such things, could get ppl to come, or the ppl might just keep complaining.

GSR experience: sometimes group members trust the trusted servants, secretary etc. if something needs to be talked about, put up on flyer, facebook group page, try to take the negativity surrounding group biz meetings and consciences.

GSR experience: one idea, had a group inventory which they had not had in a while, advertised it, etc. got a lot of ppl to come, they discussed this issue about biz meetings there, ppl just didn't understand the importance of them and what they actually do.

BB: when in trusted position, bring up what 7th tradition is for, including sending the GSR to Area etc. so others can ask questions and learn.

GSR experience: have strong sponsorship that teaches their sponsees about the ins and outs of service, and what we all do as a group.

GSR experience: GSR runs biz meetings. Wants them to go smoothly, how to handle ppl just talking without introductions etc.

BB: remind to the best of your ability to say, to raise hands, so everyone has a chance. etc. cannot be AA police, change behavior of humans or heard cats. Be a good example.

GSR Q; cannot get ppl interested in service, has been GSR for 15 years, need spirit of rotation.

BB: what not to do, threaten. Say if we don't have a GSR, we won't have someone representing us at Area. Albeit this is not a fit for everyone this type of service. If you do it over and over, some ppl won't step up because that person is continuing to do it, go without until someone steps up.

GSR experience: leave space so someone can have the opportunity to come to the decision that it is their time to step up.

GSR Question: who do we talk to about taking meetings into Mental Health facilities. CPC/PI etc.

BB: start with educating facilities about AA, but most importantly to have volunteers to support these meetings, go to DCMs to talk about it and also attend today's CPC committee.

BB: Scenario: someone in your home group, someone with outside issues starts working steps finding out they are not alcoholic. What do we do?

BB: some ppl have problems with both, we can help with Alcoholic problem but they will need to go elsewhere such as NA for drug use, because we don't have the experience.

GSR experience: as long as they have the desire to stop drinking, okay.

GSR experience: go to both programs, goes to where the recovery is at.

GSR Q: Group is all men, want to be accepting to all, how to get women to come? Accept situ, or does others have experience? Wait and see? Do you do something to grow female membership? Thought to ask the body.

BB: make sure women feel safe, have good examples of men in group to take care of any issues.

BB Scenario: how many groups have committees? not many. District committees aren't just the chairs, but comprised of others doing service in the committee.

GSR Q; who votes? where do we learn what to do?

BB: Do you have a service manual? In the part under 'three legacies of service' explains voting. Also we will have our SWR trustee run our elections.

Past Delegates pass out paper, person stand for position, we vote, they pick up the paper and we make sure it's 2/3rd, if not, goes back to paper votes, if many candidates and if they don't have 1/5 they are taking them off and then keep voting. If never 2/3rds and two candidates, goes to hat.

Ken Literature chair, has service manuals! All info in there.

GSR Q: what positions are we voting for?

Lists some and explains what their service is etc.

Cooperation with Professionals (CPC), Cheryl H.

We had a great meeting today with 10 districts represented and 30 members. CPC is active in Area 25. Sample letters from the CPC workbook have been out in Douglas County to the KU school of Law, School of Nursing and various other entities. There have been members taking pamphlets with hotline cards to human resource individuals to places such as Menards and Home Depot. Also have given out pamphlets to physicians and other HC professionals. Professionals have been called with little response so letters with pamphlets were sent. We also discussed the LinkedIn website and how we need to let professionals know that Alcoholics Anonymous World Service can be a valuable resource for them. We discussed checking to see about getting meetings back into the state hospitals.

Grape Free Press, Gena W.

Great committee meeting with lots of discussion and new ideas—for those who aren't familiar with the Grape Free Press, it is our Area 25 Kansas newsletter. Committee reports, events, the agenda for the next Assembly or Committee Meetings, memorials, birthdays are included, anonymity protected.

There are 3 ways to get the GFP: 1) a pdf version is emailed to all on the Area email list when published. 2) It is posted on the Area 25 website, and 3) for those without computer access, we print paper copies and send to the DCMs to distribute. We are currently printing 120 copies mailing to 17 districts.

The ideas the committee came up with were:

1. Ask a question to readers in one issue to elicit a response of experience that will be printed in the next issue.
2. Working with the Chronicler, add blurbs about the history of AA in Kansas.
3. Since the GFP isn't translated into Spanish, we want to invite our Spanish speaking districts to write a section about their activities and events to be printed in Spanish.

Grapevine, Tama C.

We started out with a discussion on how we used and promoted the Grapevine in our meetings.

There is a podcast for the Grapevine that is called the Grapevine Variety Show. It comes out on every Monday with fun topics. One person asked about how to publish a story in the Grapevine, so we had a discussion on submitting a story, that is needed to be submitted 6 months in advance and it could take a long time before it gets published or it may not get published.
